Please find below the Aneurin Bevan University Health Board response to the above consultation. The response was co-ordinated by the Health Board Director of Public Health, Dr Sarah Aitken

The response relates to the **Circular Economy** section of the Ministers priorities:

With respect to the *Circular Economy*, the NHS procures vast quantities of single use materials and generates large volumes of plastic waste. There is scope for the NHS to use more reusable products and to improve the recycling of products where single use is the only acceptable choice e.g. for infection control. PPE is particularly topical now and single use face masks more specifically.

Most NHS procurement is conducted at the national level as is most infection control policy. That means there would need to be a national approach to setting an expectation that the NHS uses reusable products where appropriate. There are now reusable medical grade masks but national policies lead to the use of disposable masks when a reusable mask could be a safe option.

Where single use is the only acceptable choice for reasons such as infection control, there is scope for more attention to be given at the procurement stage to ensuring products are made of recyclable materials plus improved processes for the safe recycling of single use, clinical products.'
